ADMISSIONS INFORMATION

To qualify for financial aid and to receive program updates, submit item #2 and complete the Accuplacer Assessment test immediately (see back for details). Students who complete the above steps and are currently enrolled in a BTC course may be eligible to register by appointment before the general public.

To be eligible for program entry on a space available basis you must submit a complete packet containing all of the following items. Forms can be downloaded from the BTC website at: www.btc.ctc.edu Student Resources/Admissions & Advising/Publications and Forms.

1. The "Radiologic Technology Application Completion Form" verifying completion of all admissions steps.
2. Admissions Application identifying the year and quarter you want to start. New students are admitted to the Radiologic Technology program fall quarter only.
3. The Applicant Notification: Washington State Patrol Criminal History Background Check form.
4. Official transcripts in sealed envelopes containing evidence of completion of the BTC prerequisites listed below. BTC transcripts can be unofficial.

* If the indicated course does not satisfy the time frame requirement but all other admissions requirements are met, your name will be put on the program ready list, but you must retake the course, or in the case of CAP 101, you may take a challenge test to be eligible to enter the program.

5. (Recommended) Health Care Experience: If you have had no health-care experience, it is strongly recommended that you arrange a job shadow, volunteer experience, or information interview.

Financial Aid Eligibility

If you are attending Bellingham Technical College to obtain your general education requirements, you may apply for financial aid to help defray the cost of course work. In order to determine your eligibility for aid, you will need to complete the following two requirements **prior** to submitting a complete packet **in addition** to filing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA):

- A. Take the Accuplacer assessment tests (or be waived from them) to determine course and program placement. The assessment tests are offered four times weekly at a variety of days and times. Call 360-752-8345 to schedule a testing appointment or to inquire about test waiver.
- B. Submit a Degree/Certificate Program Admissions Application identifying the year and quarter you want to start.

Cohort Locations

The program is planned with a regional focus in collaboration with Edmonds Community College, Everett Community College, North Seattle Community College, Peninsula College, Skagit Valley College, and Whatcom Community College. As part of the admissions process, you will be asked to select and rank your preference for placement at the Bellingham or Everett cohort sites. Bellingham cohort students attend classes at Bellingham Technical College. Everett cohort students attend classes at the Everett Community College. Students will be assigned regional clinical experience, on a variety of shifts, in hospitals and clinics in Whatcom, Skagit, Island, Snohomish, and King counties.

Enrollment Requirements Post Acceptance

- Attend an orientation session which includes participating in a mandatory 11-panel drug screen
- Submit a complete Health Status Report
- Submit \$10 payment for criminal background check processing fee

Prior to your registration and attendance in future quarters of the Radiologic Technology program you will also be notified to submit evidence medical insurance and proof of 18 years of age.

Sequence & Schedule

The Radiologic Technology Associate of Applied Science degree program is 7 quarters in length. First year students attend fall, winter, spring, and summer. Second year students attend fall, winter, and spring. Courses will be scheduled at a variety of times during the day, late afternoon, and evening. Some courses will be provided online and some using video conference media at Everett and Bellingham. Clinical shifts may be from 8 to 12 hours dependent on the quarter and may vary from days, evenings, or weekends at a variety of clinics and hospitals. Students must be able to accommodate the various clinical schedules.
